

Pediculosis, also known as head lice, is a common condition found in school-age children. Pediculosis is highly contagious and easily spread from direct or indirect contact with the infested person and/or infested personal items.

A. School Procedures:

1. Students in grades K–5 will be screened at the beginning of the school year, and may be rescreened periodically throughout the year. Students in grades 6-12 will be screened as necessary. Any new student may be examined upon request for entry to school. Screenings will be conducted by a school employee trained in head lice screening procedures.

2. When a case of head lice is found, all the students in the same classroom (K-5) may be examined. The parent/guardian of the infected student will be notified of the condition, and if the child has siblings attending other district schools the schools will be notified.

B. Protocols for handling an infestation:

1. When a child is determined to have lice or nits:

a. If live lice are found or observed, the parent/guardian will be notified and the student will be excluded from school until the student is nit and lice free.

b. If no live lice are observed, but a child has nits, the parent/guardian will be notified of the condition.

i. If fewer than ten (10) nits are observed by the screener the student will be allowed to remain in school for the remainder of the day. When the parent/guardian is contacted due to the presence of nits, they will be informed about the district policy and will be given information regarding treatment, and an opportunity to view the nits found during the school screening.

ii. If more than ten (10) nits are observed by the screener the child will be excluded from school until the student is nit and lice free. The parent/guardian will be provided the district policy regarding nits and/or live lice and information regarding the treatment, and an opportunity to view the nits or lice found during the school screening.

c. Once excluded from school for having lice or nits, the student must be reexamined before readmission to school, and a parent or designee for the parent must accompany the student and be present for the readmission screening. The student will only be readmitted if he/she is determined to be nit and lice free. A student who is reexamined and determined to have nits or any live lice will continue to be excluded from school.

- d. If the student returns to school the same day as diagnosis and treatment, the student must wear a different set of clothing (including a different coat).
- e. Any child who is found to have lice or nits will be screened again seven to ten (7 - 10) days after the condition is discovered, or after having been readmitted to school.

C. Administrative Handling:

1. When the parent/guardian is contacted due to an infestation they will be provided the district policy regarding students having lice, information regarding treatment, and an opportunity to view nits or lice from the student.
2. Each infestation will be recorded by the school identifying the student's name, date the infestation was discovered, date student returned to school after treatment, and 7 day rescreening results.
3. Once a student is determined to have lice, nits, or both, the student must return to school lice and nit free within 2 school days (defined as the remainder of the current school day plus one more school day) from the time of the original determination.
 - a. Within those first two school days, if the student misses any school due to the presence of nits or live lice, the absences will be recorded as medical absences approved by the school (recorded as medical-lice absences).
 - b. Each additional day that a student misses school due to a head lice related condition (during the remainder of that academic year) will be recorded as an unexcused lice absence. (Refer to WSD Attendance Policy 501.1 for student attendance requirements.)

INFORMATION REGARDING MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Normally the parent shall administer a child's medication either at home or at school. When it is essential that a child take oral medication during school hours and the parent cannot be at school to administer the medication, only the nurse or the principal's designee shall assist in the self-administration of the medication.

It is required that a parent complete and sign a form in the school office that identifies the child, the medication, the purpose, time and dosage given, side effects and termination date. Children are not allowed to hand-carry the medication to school. A parent or guardian must bring it to the office and make sure that a completed form is on file.

The parent of the child shall assume full responsibility for informing the school of any change in the health or change in medication. Requests shall be made in writing.

A complete copy of our District's medication policy shall be provided to the parent upon request, and the parent shall agree in writing that because of the schedule and other responsibilities it is permissible for a dosage to be delayed or missed totally. If the parent refuses to accept this condition, the Weiser School District shall reject the request to administer medication at school.

WEISER SCHOOL DISTRICT BUS RULES

Rules:

1. Follow the directions of bus driver the first time given.
2. Stay in your seat.
3. Keep all parts of your body IN the bus.
4. No pushing, shoving or fighting.
5. No eating or drinking on the bus.
6. Be at your pick-up point on time.

CONSEQUENCES:

1. The first report of unsatisfactory conduct shall result in a warning and parents called. A copy of notification will be sent home.
2. The second report of violation a report will be sent home and conference required with parent. (No suspension until after conference).
3. The third violation or severe offense will be referred to the building principal for possible suspension or complete denial of transportation privileges. (Conference with parent or guardian.)
4. Subsequent offenses may result in the student being denied transportation privileges for the remainder of the school year.
5. The Principal/Vice-principal has the discretionary authority to go directly to any step he/she feels best addresses the severity of the offense.

ABESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN

In compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Action of 1986, each Weiser School District building was inspected and asbestos containing materials were identified. Weiser School District Policy 09-10

DRESS CODE

It is the position of the Weiser School District that the appropriate and acceptable appearance of students is essential to a positive learning environment. Students are expected to dress in a manner that is suitable for school and appropriate for the weather. Students are expected to take pride in their dress, grooming, and general appearance. In all areas of the school, students must dress modestly and in good taste.

Violations: Wearing clothing that is immodest, detracts, or disrupts the educational environment, or may jeopardize the safety of the individual or others is considered inappropriate. Inappropriate attire includes but is not limited to:

- A. Hats, hoods, bandannas, or other head gear in the building.
- B. Clothing with logos, words, or pictures that are vulgar, disrespectful, sexually suggestive, or profane; or that advocate violence, prejudice or tobacco, alcohol, or other drug use.
- C. Tube, midriff, tank tops, half shirts, cutouts. (Tops must have at least 3 inches of material covering the shoulder, show no cleavage, and must be full length covering the midriff.)
- D. Mini skirts, track or other short shorts. (Hemlines are to be no higher than 6 inches from the center of the knee—or must have material beyond extended fingers while standing straight.)
- E. Spandex-type shorts or tights (without dress, shorts or other cover), Pajamas, boxers, slippers.
- F. Clothing that may be gang related. Gang related attire includes, but is not limited to: hats, bandannas, or articles of clothing with writing, markings, or symbols of gang affiliation. Flying “colors” or wearing a single color of gang affiliation. Sagging pants, extra long belts or other paraphernalia. Building administrators will follow recommended guidelines as set by local, state and federal law enforcement.

Consequences for Dress Code Violations:

Building administrators may use their discretion to determine inappropriate dress and to administer appropriate consequences based on building level policy. Violations may be considered minor, serious, or severe depending on the nature of the violation.

Póliza del Distrito Escolar de Weiser

CÓDIGO DE VESTIR

Es la posición del Distrito Escolar de Weiser que la apariencia adecuada y aceptable de los estudiantes es esencial para un ambiente de aprendizaje positivo. Los estudiantes deben vestirse de una manera que es adecuado para la escuela y apropiada para el clima. Se espera que los estudiantes se enorgullecen de su vestido, el aseo y la apariencia general. En todos los ámbitos de la escuela, los estudiantes se deben vestir modestamente y de buen gusto.

Violaciones: Teniendo puesto ropa que es inmodesto, resta, o perturbe el ambiente educativo, o puede poner en peligro la seguridad de la persona o los demás se considera inapropiada. Atuendo inapropiado incluye pero no limitado a:

- A. Sombreros, gorras, pañuelos, o otras formas de artículos de cabeza en el edificio.
- B. Ropa con logos, palabras o imágenes que son vulgares, irrespetuoso, sugestiva sexualmente, profano; o que apoya la violencia, los prejuicios, el tabaco, alcohol o otras drogas.
- C. Blusas sin tirantes, camisetas de tirantes, camisetas de media, recortes. (debe tener al menos 3 pulgadas de material que cubre el hombro, no usar camisetas escotadas, y debe ser de longitud completa que cubre el estómago.)
- D. Minifaldas, o pantalones muy cortos. (Vastillas no deben ser superiores a 6 pulgadas desde el centro de la rodilla – o tienen que tener material pasando los dedos extendidos mientras está de pie recto.)
- E. Pantalones cortos tipo Spandex o medias (sin vestido, pantalones cortos o otras formas de cubrimientos), pijamas, boxers, pantuflas.
- F. Ropa que se puede relacionar a las pandillas. Ropa que se refiere a las pandillas incluye pero no limitado a: sombreros, pañuelos, o artículos de vestir con escritura, marcas o símbolos de afiliación a la pandilla. Demostrando "colores" o usando un color de afiliación a las pandillas. Pantalones caídos, cinturones largas o otra parafernalia. Los administradores de edificios seguirán las pautas recomendadas según establecido por la ley local, estatal y federal.

Consecuencias para Violaciones del Código de Vestir:

Los administradores del edificio pueden usar su discreción para determinar la vestimenta inapropiada y para administrar las consecuencias apropiadas basadas en las pólizas del edificio. Violaciones pueden considerarse leves, graves o severas dependiendo en la naturaleza de la violación.

- A. Students must be in school ninety percent (90%) of the time that school is in session. Each school shall keep accurate attendance records.
- B. Excluded from the calculations for attendance are extraordinary absences. Extraordinary absences shall be those absences beyond the control of the local Board of Trustees, students, or parent. Extraordinary absences are generally non-repetitive in nature. Absences for District approved (co-curricular, athletic) activities shall be classified as extraordinary, and therefore, will not be counted in calculating the attendance percentage. Other extraordinary absences may include: extended illnesses, funerals, doctor, or dentist appointments (documentation must be provided), or other emergencies that may arise. Absences not included as extraordinary absences will include, but are not limited to: hunting trips, shopping trips, work, senior skips, absences of family convenience, or other non-sanctioned activities.
- C. Upon the 9th absence in a semester, the student and the parents or guardians will be notified that the student is in jeopardy of being classified as an habitual truant, unless the parent or guardian has provided the proper documentation of extraordinary absence. Proper documentation may be in the form of a doctor's note or parent note. Documentation will be provided to an attendance review committee at each building which shall meet no more than 10 days from the date of parent notification. The parent notice will contain the date, time, and location of the attendance review. The attendance review committee may refer the student to the Weiser School District Board of Trustees for an official board review of the absences and the student's status as an habitual truant.
- D. Any student in violation of this 90% attendance policy may be considered an habitual truant. "An habitual truant is any public school pupil who, in the judgment of the board of trustees, repeatedly has violated the attendance regulations established by the board" (Idaho Code 33-206). Students that are declared an habitual truant will not receive credit even though their grades may be passing. "A child who is an habitual truant shall come under the purview of the juvenile corrections act if he or she is within the age of compulsory attendance" (Idaho Code 33-206).
- E. An absence which has not been cleared by the school, parent, or legal guardian will be considered a truancy. A truancy may be for an entire day or a single period. A student who leaves school grounds without checking out through the office will be considered truant.
- F. Truancies are serious disciplinary infractions and may lead to expulsion. In cases of truancy, no credit will be given for the day(s) missed and students will not be allowed to make up assignments or exams for credit. If a student is truant 3 times in a school year, the student will be suspended and may be referred to the local Board of Trustees for an expulsion hearing. If the Board declares the student an habitual truant, the student may be expelled from the Weiser School District and shall come under the purview of the juvenile corrections act if he or she is within the age of compulsory attendance (7-16 years of age).
- G. Being on time is a desirable lifelong trait for the students of Weiser schools. Each building will establish a tardy policy in place and follow building procedures to motivate students to attend class on time. In grades 6-12 students will be considered tardy if they attend class after class begins and before the first fifteen (15) minutes of the period. If a student arrives to class after the first fifteen (15) minutes, he/she will be considered absent and will affect attendance calculations accordingly.

Querido Padre / Guardian,

Esta carta es para informarle de la nueva póliza de asistencia del Distrito Escuela De Weiser (501.1), y cómo esta póliza puede afectar a su niño/a mientras que asista a la Escuela de Weiser

La nueva póliza es diseñada para promover la asistencia en la Escuela y aumento del logro del estudiante. EL intento de esta póliza fue para motivar al estudiante quién elige no atender a clases en la escuela, para no castigar a el estudiante que falta a clases en la escuela debido a circunstancias extraordinarias.

Los estudiantes deben atender el noventa por ciento (90%) del tiempo que la escuela está en sesión. Si un estudiante debe faltar a clases en la escuela por una ausencia extraordinaria, por favor de envíe un nota para explicar la ausencia. Las ausencias creer ser extraordinarias no contarán contra la póliza de la asistencia del 90%.

Las ausencias extraordinarias son generalmente no repetitivas en naturaleza. Ausencias que el Distrito aprobara (co-perteneiente, atlético) actividades será clasificado como extraordinario, y por lo tanto, no ser contado en calcular el porcentaje de la asistencia. Otras ausencias extraordinarias pueden incluir: enfermedades extendidas, entierros, doctor, o citas del dentista (la documentación debe ser proporcionada), o otras emergencias que pueden presentarse. Las ausencias no incluidas como ausencias extraordinarias incluirán, pero no se limitan: la cazeria los viajes de compras, trabajo, ausencias de conveniencia de la familia, u otras actividades no-sancionadas.

Si su niño/a alcanza nueve ausencias en un semestre (no incluyendo ausencias extraordinarias), esto se lo notificarán a usted que ella/está en peligro de ser clasificado como tunante habitual, a menos que usted proporcione el documentación apropiado de la ausencia extraordinaria. Esto puede estar en la forma de una nota de un doctor o nota del padre.

La falta de proporcionar tal documentación dará lugar a una reunión con el comité de la revisión de la asistencia para evaluar los expedientes de la asistencia de su niño/a. Si el comité no puede clarificar the ausencias como extraordinarias, su niño/a puede ser referido Consejo De Administradores para la acción adicional. El Consejo De Administradores podra declarar a su niño/a un tunante habitual y referir el caso al abogado de procesamiento local para la acción adicional contra el padre/guardian. Su niño/a puede también ser considerado para la Escuela del Verano, o retención si están en la violación de esta póliza de asistencia.
